JAG Corps seeking FLEP candidates

The Office of The Judge Advocate General is now accepting applications for the Army's Funded Legal Education Program. Under this program, the Army projects sending up to 15 active duty commissioned officers to law school at government expense if funding permits. Selected officers will attend law school beginning the Fall of 2007 and will remain on active duty while attending law school. Interested officers should review Chapter 14, AR 27-1,

The Judge Advocate General's Funded Legal Education Program to determine their eligibility. This program is open to commis-

sioned officers in the rank of second lieutenant through captain. Applicants must have at least two but not more than six years of total active federal service at the time legal training begins.

Eligibility is governed by statute (10 U.S.C. 2004) and is non-waivable. Eligible officers interested in applying should immediately register for the earliest offering of the Law School Admission Test.

Applicants must send their request through command channels, to include the officer's branch manager at AHRC, with a copy furnished to the Office of the Judge Advocate General, Attn: DAJA-PT Yvonne Caron, 1777 North Kent Street, Rosslyn, VA 22209-2194, to be received before Nov. 1. Court Marshal results

Unless noted otherwise, courts-martial begin at 9 a.m. The courtroom is located on the 3rd floor of Bldg. 13. Open seating in the courtroom is very limited. If units desire to observe a court-martial proceeding for professional development, they should coordinate in advance with the Chief, Criminal Law Division, at 568-4606. No weapons of any type, electronic devices (including cell phones, pagers, and PDAs), food, or beverages are allowed in the courtroom. Members of the public, to include their children, are welcome to attend the courts-martial, but all are reminded that because of the seriousness of the proceedings, proper decorum must be strictly observed at all times.

U.S. v. Staff Sgt. Toby L. Schmidt

On July 12, a military judge sitting as a special court-martial convicted Staff Sgt. Toby L. Schmidt, A Company, 31st Combat Support Hospital, 31st ADA Brigade, pursuant to his pleas of: one specification of larceny of military property of a value greater than \$500, and one specification of wrongful sale of military property of a value greater than \$500. The military judge sentenced Schmidt to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of private (E-1), to perform hard labor for 60 days, to be fined \$4,000 (to be confined for 10 months if the fine is not paid), and to be discharged from the Army with a bad conduct discharge.

U.S. v. Pvt. Dana W. Naylor

On July 13, a military judge sitting as a general court-martial convicted Pvt. Dana W. Naylor, D Battery, 2nd Battalion, 43rd Air Defense Artillery, 108th ADA Brigade, pursuant to his pleas of: one specification of absence without leave; two specifications of wrongful use of an opiate based, Schedule II, controlled substance, and benzodiazepine, a Schedule IV controlled substance; one specification of accessory after the fact for a larceny; one specification of conspiracy to sell government property; one specification of wrongful sale of military property of a value less than \$500, and one specification of wrongful receipt of military property of a value less than \$500. The military judge sentenced Naylor to be confined for eight months, to forfeit all pay and allowances, and to be discharged from the Army with a bad conduct discharge.

U.S. v. Pfc. Scott A. Hopkins

On July 14, a military judge sitting as a special court-martial convicted Pfc. Scott A. Hopkins, B Battery, 2nd Battalion, 43rd Air Defense Artillery, 108th ADA Brigade, pursuant to his pleas, of: one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, and one specification of wrongful use of marijuana. The military judge sentenced Hopkins, to be reduced to E-1 and confined for five months.
