Courts-martial results

U.S. v. Spc. Curtis D. Coker, Jr.

A military judge sitting as a general court-martial convicted Spc. Curtis D. Coker, Jr., Service Battery, 2nd Battalion, 43rd Air Missile Defense, 108th ADA Brigade, pursuant to Coker's pleas, of conspiracy to steal and sell military property, selling and stealing military property of more than \$500. The judge sentenced Coker to be reduced to the grade of private and to be confined for twelve months March 22.

U.S. v. Pvt. Juan P. Aguilar

A military judge sitting as a general court-martial convicted Pvt. Juan P. Aguilar, 4th Brigade Combat Team, 1st Cavalry Division (Rear)(Provisional), contrary to Aguilar's pleas, of desertion with intent to avoid hazardous duty. The

military judge also convicted Aguilar, pursuant to Aguilar's pleas, of importation and possession of 33 pounds of marijuana with intent to distribute. The judge sentenced Aguilar to confinement for 20 months and a Bad Conduct Discharge March 27.

U.S. v. Spc. Robert H. Fitch

A military judge sitting as a general court-martial convicted Spc. Robert H. Fitch, Service Battery, 2nd Battalion, 43rd Air Missile Defense, 108th Air Defense Artillery Brigade, pursuant to Fitch's pleas, of conspiracy to steal and sell military property, selling and stealing military property of more than \$500. The military judge sentenced Fitch to be reduced to the grade of private, and to be confined for 15 months March 29.

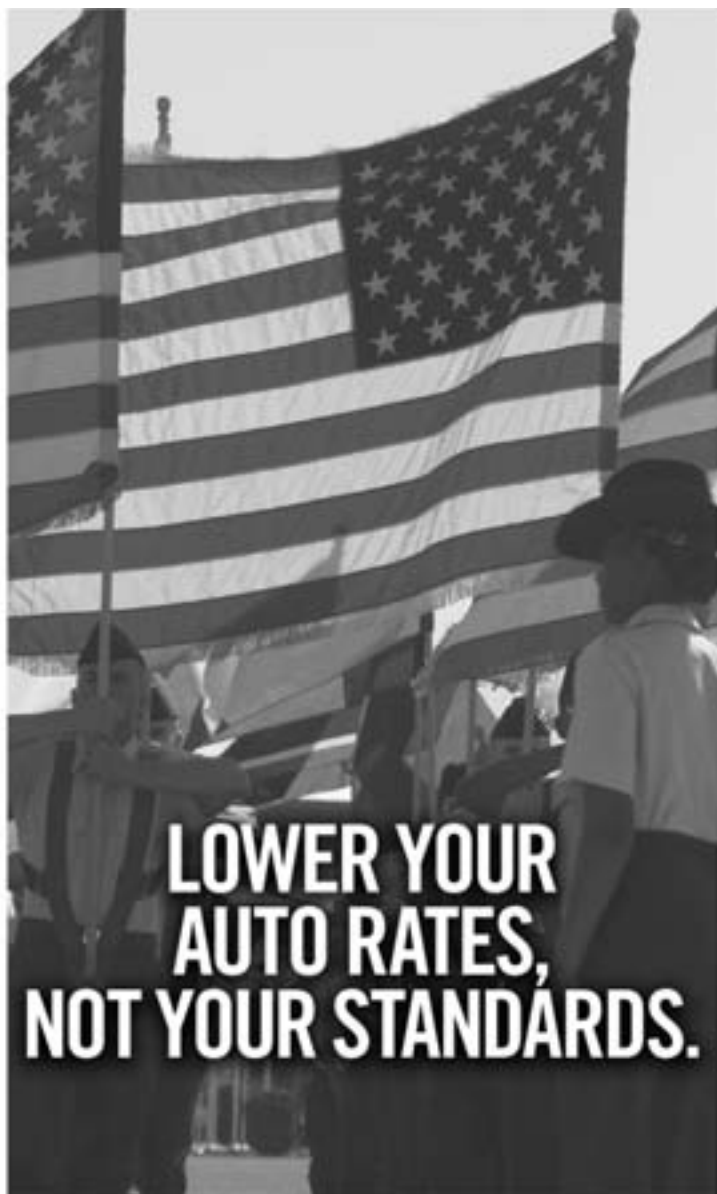
